2013-2014 accomplishments & highlights

While we have work ahead in delivering the strongest education and depth of experience for our children, we appreciate the opportunity to look back and reflect on our accomplishments from the 2013-2014 school year. Over the past year, our most significant accomplishments included:

- Tamarack has a new and updated website, www.tamarackwaldorf.org! The site contains class information, TWS sponsored events, and school activities.
- Tamarack Waldorf High School initiative spent the year preparing to open a new high school for the 2014-2015 school year.
- Many of our 8th graders tested proficient or advanced in all five WKCE subject areas, with social studies the high point at 94%.
- The Contemporary Music Ensemble performed at the Conservatory of Music's Festival of Trees and Music in November 2013.
- We had waiting lists in our K4, K5, 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades for 2014-15.

- In a stunning finish to the season, the Tamarack Knights 5th – 8th grade boys team took 1st place in the 8th grade division of the MPS Beulah Brinton Basketball League.
- Tamarack was featured in *Renewal*, a national Waldorf magazine.

milwaukee parental choice program performance results

The Milwaukee Parental Choice Program (MPCP) is a state voucher program that allows students from low income families to attend any participating private school located in the city at no charge. As a participating MPCP school, Tamarack is required to administer assessment testing for Grades 4-8. However, students are not required to take the test, as Waldorf curriculum avoids standardized testing for early grades. Tamarack had 88 MPCP students eligible to take the test. Of these, 40 took the test, joined by 7 private pay students. Below is the grade 8 performance results, reflecting only the scores of Tamarack 8th grade students who participated in the MPCP test.

Festivals are a joyous celebration of the cycles and transitions of life, and an important part of school life at Tamarack. By celebrating festivals, we strive to nourish the souls of our children and ourselves. Rudolf Steiner, the founder of Waldorf Education, stated that by "living into" the season changes of the year, one grows spiritually. This past year, Tamarack celebrated Michaelmas Festival of Courage, Martinmas Lantern Walk, Advent Winter Garden, and May Festival.

michaelmas festival of courage

Michaelmas, our autumn festival, is a festival of courage. The legend of St. Michael and the dragon inspires courage within us. From the bounty of nature we gather the fruits of the harvest and store up the light to guide us through the darkness of winter. Into darkness and fear, Michael wields his sword of light, that we might so be inspired to face the inner and outer darkness with renewed strength of will and purpose in our lives. All grades participate in the celebration. The array of children's activities makes this an extraordinary event for our families, as well as the community at large.



martinmas lantern walk

The Martinmas – Lantern Walk Festival is celebrated in honor of St. Martin, who became known as the patron saint of the poor. He is remembered for his deeds of goodness and acts of kindness. As St. Martin spread warmth and light



to his fellow human beings, this festival of light reminds us to spread our own light and warmth as we enter into the autumnal equinox, the darkest time of the year. Martinmas is a family event that is led by the teachers. Children make lanterns and carry them through the streets in early evening. As they walk, their lanterns light the darkness.

winter garden

As the days grow shorter, it is time to turn inward and create a light of our own. The Winter Garden marks the beginning of the darkest time of the year. Evergreen boughs are laid on the floor to create a spiral. In the center of the spiral is a lit candle. Walking the spiral as an individual is a



reflection of every human being's journey to an inner place where the light is found and gives us strength to sustain us through dark times.

The May Festival is a long celebrated tradition that welcomes spring. It is one of our biggest community events of the year, and takes place in early May. The event connects the school to the larger community and celebrates the spirit by which Waldorf schools nourish the whole child. The children make and wear floral wreaths and herald the arrival of spring with



dance and song. The most iconic element of the celebration is the maypole dance. This tradition evokes the same pride and spirit as it did in the festivals centuries ago. Food and children's activities add to the gaiety of this special day.

tamarack parent association – community circle

Tamarack's parent body helps shape the cultural life of the school and participates in the decision making process. Called Tamarack Parent Association – Community Circle (TPA-CC), the group is an integral branch of school life and governance.

TPA-CC serves as a vital link between parents and the other bodies of the school, including the Faculty, Administration and Board of Trustees. TPA-CC's primary goals are to give parents an active voice in the school community, to respond to parental concerns, and to support Tamarack in a number of roles. One of the major goals of TPA-CC in the 2013-14 school year was to facilitate communication from the three areas of school (Faculty, Administration and Board) to the parents in the smoothest manner possible.

Two primary means of support TPA-CC provides for the school are fundraising and volunteerism. Funds raised from weekly bagel sales, Brady Street BID #11 street events, the Smoothie Social, Winter Fair and Revels of Spring Benefit Party enhance school life and education for Tamarack students. For the sixth year in a row, TPA-CC used their raised funds to purchase every Tamarack child a student membership from the Urban Ecology Center (UEC). Each class uses the student memberships with a minimum of one field trip to the UEC for the year. The UEC membership is one of the proudest aspects of TPA-CC, especially when the group sees the children get out of the buses after a field trip with smiles and so many stories to tell.

Tamarack's parent community is a wonderfully diverse and energetic group of parents who share the common goal of wanting an excellent Waldorf education for their children. More than that, parents help Tamarack with heartfelt energy and vast quantities of time. As TPA-CC looks to the future, the group will continue to improve parent involvement at Tamarack. Every parent at the school is a member of TPA-CC. It is the group's goal to see 100% parent participation in TPA-CC and Tamarack parental activities.

tamarack waldorf high school

Since its early years, Tamarack has known of the desire and need from the community for a Tamarack Waldorf High School. In the spring 2013, a dedicated group of volunteers took up the initiative to develop and build a high school, with the aim of opening a ninth grade for the 2014-15 school year. The initiative's feasibility study was unanimously approved by the faculty and Board of Trustees of Tamarack Waldorf School in the summer 2013.

An in-house High School Working Group comprised of Faculty, Administration, parents and Board members met weekly for a year, working on every aspect of the new high school, including personnel, enrollment, site search, budgeting, curriculum and long-range planning.

In the spring 2014, Tamarack received a grant from the Walton Family Foundation. The grant will provide funding for science, environmental studies, technology, and capital and build-out costs for the new school. Tamarack Waldorf High School will initially serve 30 Grade 9 students, but will expand by one grade level each year, reaching a capacity of 120 students by the 2017-18 academic year.

Tamarack Waldorf High School will provide a vigorously academic, artistically creative and socially relevant curriculum to its students. The high school will cultivate analytical and creative thinking in students, while demonstrating through their daily work the meaningfulness of the world around them, and their place in it.

As an extension of Tamarack Waldorf School, the high school completes the school's mission. The education of the adolescent allows for hands-on engagement in the community and the Waldorf goal of transforming idealism into initiative. Additionally, the high school will participate in the Milwaukee Parental Choice Program.

We are grateful to those parents, Faculty, staff and volunteers involved with the High School Working Group for the investment they have made in the growth of our school.
